A. Highlights of the Activity:

As part of Linggo ng Lingkod at Likha 2025, Saint Mary's University, through the Office of the Associate Dean of Student Affairs and Services (ADSAS), in partnership with the Bayombong Land Transportation Office (LTO), conducted the "Kappia ken Talged: Marian Traffic Management and Safety Forum (cum Theoretical Driving Course)" on April 24, 2025, at the SMU Calungsod Hall from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM.

This timely initiative aimed to raise awareness on critical traffic management issues, promote road safety education, and offer a free Theoretical Driving Course (TDC) to members of the SMU community. The TDC is an essential step for those applying for student driver's permits and was made more accessible through this collaboration.

The forum was facilitated by officials from the Bayombong LTO, who delivered informative lectures on road rules, traffic signs, driving discipline, and safety regulations. The discussions also addressed local traffic concerns, reinforcing the importance of responsible road use in preventing congestion and accidents.

The activity drew active participation from Marian students, employees, and their families, who welcomed the opportunity to learn and engage in practical, community-centered topics. The integration of the free TDC made the program especially meaningful for many participants, aligning with the weeklong celebration's theme of service and innovation.

As part of the broader observance of Linggo ng Lingkod at Likha, this event underscored the university's commitment to social responsibility, civic engagement, and holistic student development. The Kappia ken Talged Forum stands as a model of how academic institutions



Joint PPOC-PADAC-PTF ELCAC MEETING $1^{\rm ST}$ QUARTER February 20, 2025, Pasalubong Center, Magsaysay, Bayombong, Nueva Vizcaya

Saint Mary's University Participates in the 1ST QUARTER Joint PPOC-PADAC-PTF ELCAC MEETING

Saint Mary's University (SMU), through the Office of Student Affairs and Services, represented by Dr. Henry F. Gamboa, participated in a joint meeting upon the invitation of the Office of the Governor of Nueva Vizcaya.

The meeting was called to order by Atty. Jose V. Gambito, Governor of Nueva Vizcaya, and a quorum was subsequently declared by SF04 Carmelo B. Andrada (Ret.), who served as the Chair and presiding officer. The joint meeting was attended by various government units, including the Provincial Task Force to End Local Communist Armed Conflict (PTF-ELCAC), Provincial Anti-Drug Abuse Council (PADAC), Provincial Peace and Order Council (PPOC), and agencies focused on traffic management. Each agency presented its accomplishment report for the First Quarter.

Key Highlights Relevant to Educational Institutions, Particularly SMU

- 1. Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA)
 - PDEA reported an alarming rise in the use of marijuana oil in vaping, urging educational institutions to remain vigilant and proactive.
 - The agency emphasized the need to intensify the enforcement of anti-vaping regulations, especially within school premises, and called for stronger collaboration between local government units (LGUs) and stakeholders to prevent the increasing prevalence of vaping among the youth.
 - The head of PDEA encouraged SMU to apply for a Drug-Free Institution certification, offering assistance in facilitating the process.
- 2. Commendation for the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP)
 - Dr. Gamboa expressed appreciation for the achievements of the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) and proposed a resolution of commendation.
 - He reaffirmed SMU's commitment to fostering collaboration with BFP, particularly through the engagement of Marian Criminology interns within the bureau's operations.
- 3. Increased Visibility of Uniformed Personnel
 - Dr. Gamboa recommended more frequent visits and enhanced visibility of uniformed personnel within SMU to foster a friendly relationship with students and ensure a sense of peace and security on campus.
 - This proposal was well received and taken into consideration by the different units of uniformed personnel present at the meeting.
- 4. Commendation for Bureau of Jail Management and Penology (BJMP)
 - Dr. Gamboa also proposed a resolution commending the achievements of BJMP personnel.

- The motion was approved and seconded by the body.
- 5. Clearing of Ponce Street Leading to SMU's Main Gate
 - Dr. Gamboa appealed for the clearing of Ponce Street, a major thoroughfare for students, employees, and visitors, emphasizing that it serves as **the university's main façade** and should remain unobstructed.
 - Provincial Director Catherine G. Allam-Miranda, CESE, acknowledged the concern and advised that the matter be coordinated with Mr. Romeo Reyes, MLGOO of Bayombong.

The meeting concluded at **4:00 P.M.**, with the next meeting scheduled for **April 15, 2025**.



- 2. Explore Collaborative Opportunities: Identify potential areas for collaboration with other government agencies or private entities based on the discussions around information sharing and joint exercises.
- 3. **Advocate for Training**: Recommend further specialized training or workshops for our team on specific advanced cybersecurity topics, such as cloud security, threat intelligence, or digital forensics, based on the emerging threats discussed.
- 4. **Review and Update Policies**: Utilize the best practices shared at the summit to review and potentially update our current cybersecurity policies and protocols.
