The objective of this activity or seminar is to plan, coordinate, and manage a seminar on Entrepreneurship Marketing Management and Business Organization for identified participants who are members of Timpuvog ti Babbalasang idi Kalman, Nueva Vizcava (TIBIK-NV) Inc, an NGO, and Masina Women's Organization. This seminar will be integrated with their developed products. The seminar on Livelihood and Skills Training on Wine and Vinegar Making aims to educate, engage, and inspire participants to apply the learning and insights they gain to their product development.

The seminar is expected to achieve the following outcomes: presenting and discussing the basics of entrepreneurship, particularly "How to Start a Business" and "Entrepreneurial Competencies"; presenting and discussing fundamental marketing management concepts, especially the 4Ps, for integration into the marketing of participants' products; and providing information on Business Organization & Management that participants can apply to their entrepreneurial endeavors.

MBA students from MMBA 203 (Marketing Management) class were divided into two groups, each consisting of nine (9) members. One group facilitated the seminar on "Livelihood and Skills Training on Wine and Vinegar Making," which took place on September 30, 2023, at Debuscherre Hotel Function Hall, Saint Mary's University, Bayombong, Nueva Vizcaya. The other group is for the October 1 activity on Chayote Quash Pickles livelihood activity.

The group had the opportunity to sponsor the outreach by contributing P200.00 each, for a total of P1,800.00 for the snacks and sharing their knowledge of basic marketing principles. Mr. Neil Jansen O. Reginalde served as the lecturer for the seminar, covering the topic "How to Market a Product: The Ps of Marketing."

In total, there were twenty-six (26) participants, including 11 women from Sitio Masina and 15 women from TIBIK, Inc.

Overall, the participants engaged with the lectures and all were satisfied and happy about the extension program provided.

Extension Program Evaluation and Analysis

A 5-Scale Rating Surveys were distributed to twenty-six participants to know their feelings towards the extension program, with 1 as the lowest and 5 as the highest.

For each criterion on the evaluation, the amounts presented were computed by multiplying the total number of responses for each criterion by the rate value (1, 2, 3, 4, 5). Then averages were calculated by dividing the TOTAL by the total number of respondents which is 26.

The table shows that the Overall Impression of participants had the highest rating of 4.92 which means that the speakers and the trainer were effective and the participants liked the overall activities held. Transportation of Participants had the lowest rate of 4.23 because there were some delays and issues in the transport of some participants since they came from a remote barrio where communication is unstable but they were immediately fetched. The total average of all criteria shows a high rate of 4.73 which signifies that participants were all satisfied and happy about the overall extension program provided.

According to the comments collected from twenty-six participants, they liked all the activities provided and commended the topic

about the 7 Ps of Marketing. Participants suggested more Entrepreneurship training and seminars specifically Mushroom Processing, Packaging, Bookkeeping and Costing.

Two faculty members from Vives University of Applied Sciences, Belgium, visited Saint Mary's University for a two-week academic visit and immersion from April 11 to 22, 2024. They were Frieke Monica Debyser and Emmy Sarah Maricke de Bruyne, both preschool teachers and internship coordinators from Vives University. They were welcomed by the SMU administrators led by University President Dr. John Octavious S. Palina in a program at the University Boardroom on April 11, 2024, 9am.

During their stay at SMU, Ms. Debyser and Ms. de Bruyne engaged in collaborative dialogues and academic exchanges with the education group of SMU: first, with the Grade School where three interns from Vives University have been deployed since January 2024; and second, with the Professional Education department for synergistic discussions about global trends and strategies in teaching and education. During their two-week visit, they attended a series of activities that include the following: class observations, school visits, and dialogues with faculty, pupils, and students.

Their visit is part of the framework of cooperation signed by SMU and Vives University in January 2022, where both universities pledged to engage in academic exchanges to advance the internationalization efforts of both universities.




7C. ASEAN Green Entrepreneurship Hackathon April 25-July 2024
