Narrative

The Department of Psychology, Social Work, and Human Services of the School of Teacher Education and Humanities conducted a resilience program for the inmates of the Nueva Vizcaya Provincial Jail (NVPJ). This is in response a needs analysis survey which showed that persons deprived of liberty (PDLs) of NVPJ have mild to moderate symptoms of depression. The project proposal entitled, "KATATAGAN: A Psychoeducational Resilience Program for Persons Deprived of Liberty at the Nueva Vizcaya Provincial Jail" was submitted to the NVPJ on August 23, 2024, and endorsed to the Governor's Office on August 24, 2023. The Provincial Governor, Atty. Jose V. Gambito, approved the project on September 5, 2024

After project approval, the project implementers provided NVPJ with a poster and sign-up sheet to allow inmates to freely join the program. Forty-four participants signed up for the project.

The project team conducted a meeting on September 7, 2024, at the Guidance and Testing Office to finalize facilitation assignments. Facilitators worked in pairs and assigned to a group of 5-7 inmate participants, as shown below:

The project began on September 14, 2021 with an orientation and pre-program survey attended by the NVPJ Warden, Retired Senior Fire Officer, Mr. Carmelo Andrada, and the PDLs who signed up for the program. The objectives of the session were to: a) introduce the program, b) conduct rapport building activities and float the pre-survey assessing

depression, anxiety, stress, and coping.

The session began with an opening prayer by Marc Gail Cornejo, MAED GC, and a welcome message from the provincial warden. Mrs. Pearl Via Coballes, the project leader, then presented the objectives of the project. Mr. Reiner Dulawan then facilitated a group dynamic activity to energize the group. After which, participants were assigned to their groups and facilitators proceeded in conducting their respective rapport building activities. The facilitators then discussed he nature of the program by explaining the content of the Group Consent Form and the implications of joining. After this, the participants answered the pre-survey. Final announcements were given and snacks were served. The session ended with a loving kindness meditation exercise at 7:20pm.

The project then proceeded with the delivery of the resilience modules on the following dates:

These sessions were conducted following the Facilitators' Manual for the resilience program.

On October 27, 2023, the team organized a Graduation Ceremony to honor the participants' accomplishments. Each participant received a certificate of completion. The ceremony featured an inspiring message from Hon. Eufemia Dacayo, Vice Governor of Nueva Vizcaya. Additionally, as a meaningful gesture, the project team donated books to the local jail as part of the graduation festivities. To conclude the celebration, team members gave dinner packs for the participants.

To assess the outcome of the program, the team conducted a post-survey for the project participants on November 9, 2023. Each group facilitator also gave tokens for their participants and provided snacks.


